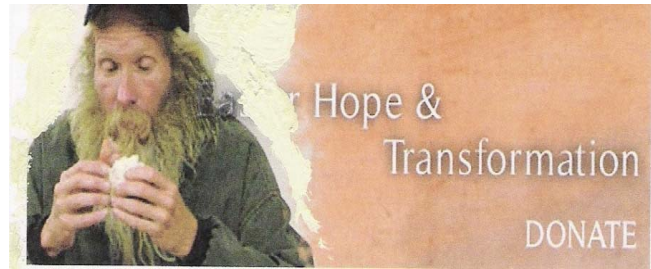

### **DESCRIBE THE MISSION: HOW IT IS OPERATED AND FUNDED**

West Side Presbyterian Church in West Seattle, Washington, has been developing a ministry force with City Team Ministries for over five years including helping to provide meals and worship services for this group. Our youth groups both college and high school levels, Men's Saturday bible study group, other West Side small groups, and dedicated individuals make up over two hundred WSPC volunteers out of our over six hundred membership that have helped serve.

We have gone out with the men from City Team on their discipleship program witnessing, praying and feeding several hundred homeless people in Pioneer Square and in the University District during the day time.

### **HOW YOUR CHURCH IS INVOLVED WITH THIS MISSION**

We have collected specific items to be used by the City Team ministry, coordinating "theme" donations as often as we can. They were thrilled to receive 360 pounds of sugar one month, 100 pairs of socks, 50 pair of shorts and several t-shirts another month. One month our focus was on laundry detergent to help with the heavy volume of clothing City Team uses for their homeless guests. Jeans, coats, blankets, sleeping bags and men's individual personal hygiene kits are just a few more of the much needed items we collect and distribute to City Team.

Around the holidays we help procure the turkeys for their Thanksgiving dinner and help in serving meals and conducting the chapel service, feeding sometimes up to 500 people. Teaming with another charitable organization, the Seattle Seafair Pirates, we fill their freezers full of meats and other frozen foods and provide several thousand dollars worth of donated toys for City Team to redistribute at Christmas time to those families less fortunate than themselves.

We also have funding through WSPC to donate during the year as a line item.
